WESTERN SUBURBS SECONDARY SCHOOLING PLAN

Public education A world of opportunities

- New City Beach College (planning name) to open in 2020.
- City Beach College first stage building program estimated to cost \$60 million.
- New \$15.4 million Doubleview Primary School.
- \$18.8 million investment to expand Carine Senior High School.

The success of the public education system has seen significant growth in demand for secondary student places in the western suburbs. To address this, the State Government's western suburbs secondary schooling plan is spearheaded by a new secondary school to be built on the former City Beach High School site, and complemented by expansion and refurbishment of primary and secondary schools in the area.

Western suburbs secondary schooling plan

- The new City Beach College (planning name) will open on the former City Beach High School site in 2020 with an estimated 250 Year 7 students and expanding to 1600 Year 7 to 12 students by 2025.
- Secondary schools being expanded as part of the plan are Churchlands Senior High School, Shenton College and Carine Senior High School.
- The plan also includes a brand new Doubleview Primary School and changes at City Beach Primary School.

Churchlands Senior High School

- A \$38.8 million expansion program is underway now and includes new classrooms, gymnasium, science and arts building, technology building and car parking to accommodate an additional 750 students.
- These state of the art facilities will increase permanent capacity from 1600 students to 2350 students.

Carine Senior High School

- An \$18.77 million expansion is to be completed in 2020 and will include general and specialist classrooms to increase permanent capacity from 1225 students to 1525 students.
- The new state of the art facilities will provide capacity for the school to host a new Gifted and Talented Education Program, focused on STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) education for students to start in 2020.

Shenton College

- A \$49.5 million expansion program includes new general classrooms, science, visual and performing arts, multimedia, IT and business studies classrooms, food technologies facilities, cafeteria, administration and car parking.
- The gymnasium will also be extended and new multipurpose sports courts will be built. A new technology and enterprise centre is also included.
- These state of the art facilities will accommodate an additional 1000 students and increase permanent capacity from 1600 students to 2600 students.

Doubleview Primary School

- The existing Doubleview Primary School will become new home to the International School of Western Australia, which has agreed to relocate from the former City Beach High School site to make way for City Beach College.
- A brand the new \$15.4 million Doubleview Primary School will be built on the southeast corner of the school site. This state of the art school will include modern classrooms and new technology for students.

City Beach Primary School

- Underutilised school facilities will be refurbished to accommodate the Japanese School in Perth, which has agreed to relocate from the former City Beach High School site.
- A brand new art, craft and music building will be added at the site to provide a dynamic environment to help stimulate the minds of budding artists.

 Students from both schools will share the facilities in the new building.

City Beach College

- The estimated \$60 million first stage building program for City Beach College will see some existing buildings refurbished to accommodate 250 Year 7 students in 2020.
- The refurbishments and first stage of the building program will start in late 2019.
- New buildings will also be constructed to increase the total accommodation to 1050 students by 2021.
- The second stage building program will include new classrooms and facilities for another 550 students by 2024.
- Once completed the state of the art City Beach College will provide for 1600 Year 7 to 12 students.

Local intake areas of secondary schools

- A new local intake area for City Beach College will be established that provides for sustainable enrolments and an entitlement for students to attend their closest public secondary school.
- The local intake areas of Churchlands Senior High School, Shenton College and Mount Lawley Senior High School will be amended accordingly.
- The new intake areas will be announced in 2017 and will take effect when City Beach College opens in 2020.
- The optional local intake area which provides an entitlement for students to attend either Carine Senior High School or Churchlands Senior High School will also be amended. From 2024, students within this area will have an entitlement to enrol at Carine Senior High School only.
- The Carine Senior High School or Churchlands Senior High School optional intake area is from a point on the Indian Ocean coastline due west of the junction of West Coast Highway and West Coast Drive, east from this point to the junction of West Coast Highway and West Coast Drive, north east along West Coast Highway to Karrinyup Road, east and south east along Karrinyup Road to Huntriss Road, south along Huntriss Road to Sackville Terrace, west along Sackville Terrace to Holbeck Street, south along Holbeck Street to Scarborough Beach Road, north west and west along Scarborough Beach Road and its western extension to the coastline and north along the coastline to a point on the coastline due west of the junction of West Coast Highway and West Coast Drive. The boundary parts of West Coast Highway (south side), Karrinyup Road (south side), Huntriss Road (both sides), Sackville Terrace (north side), Holbeck Street (both sides) and Scarborough Beach Road (north side) are included within this optional area.
- For the change of local intake areas in 2020, students enrolled at their local secondary school in 2019 will be able to complete their schooling at that school. Younger siblings of these students will be able to commence their secondary schooling at that school as long as the older sibling is also enrolled. Once commenced, siblings will be able to complete their schooling at that school. The same process will apply in 2023 for the change to the Churchlands Senior High School and Carine Senior High School optional local intake area.
